## **5** Alternatives

- 1. A modern art poster/various graffiti design.
- 2. An educational chart to teach children about various objects.
- 3. A subsection of a game where you flip different grids and have two same patterns match.
- 4. A bulletin for students just moving into a dorm and the symbols guiding them about the essentials.
- 5. A medical info sheet from a doctor advising things to do to stay healthy: drink plenty of water, use a Zen bowl to help with meditation, eat on time, wear filtering glasses when staring at screens, play games to keep your mind active, and travel to different places.

Of the 5 alternatives, I choose to go with the second option since I could think of the most possibilities for it:

- 1. An icon hunt where you are supposed to search for the design placed all over the surroundings.
- 2. Flashcards in the shape of the icons with an interesting fact about each object
- 3. A coloring book featuring these icons.
- 4. A historical timeline chart detailing when each object was founded/created.
- An educational video that make use of each of these elements in some way to narrate a storys

I complied some templates I could find online into a coloring book. I wasn't sure how water should be colored so I left it out. The interesting thing for me would be to see if a child would also color the circular grids of the Connect Four board.
